## TECHNICAL CHARACTERISTICS

M200 allows to **control remotely** doors, gates and parking systems. In addition, it is possible to **commute equipments that requires turning your system on or off at distance**, such as alarms, heat pumps and/or air conditioners.

All settings can be made via SMS or Bluetooth, which also allows to operate the outputs. In addition, communication via phone call with M200, which can be used to give opening or closing orders, is carried out for **FREE**, as the communicator rejects the call and executes the given order.

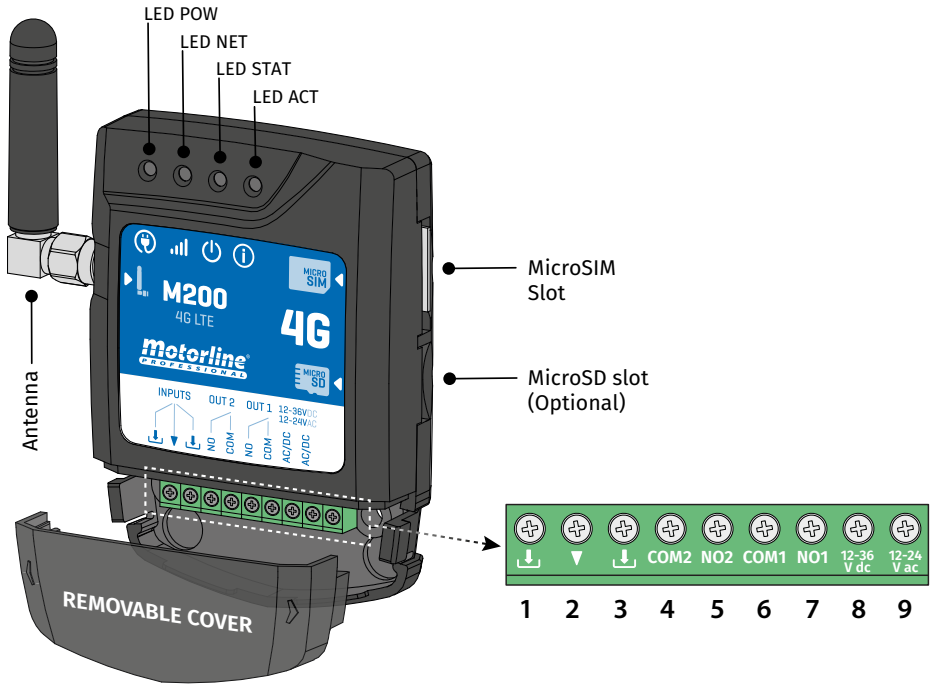

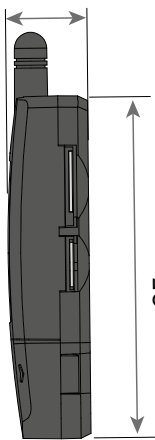

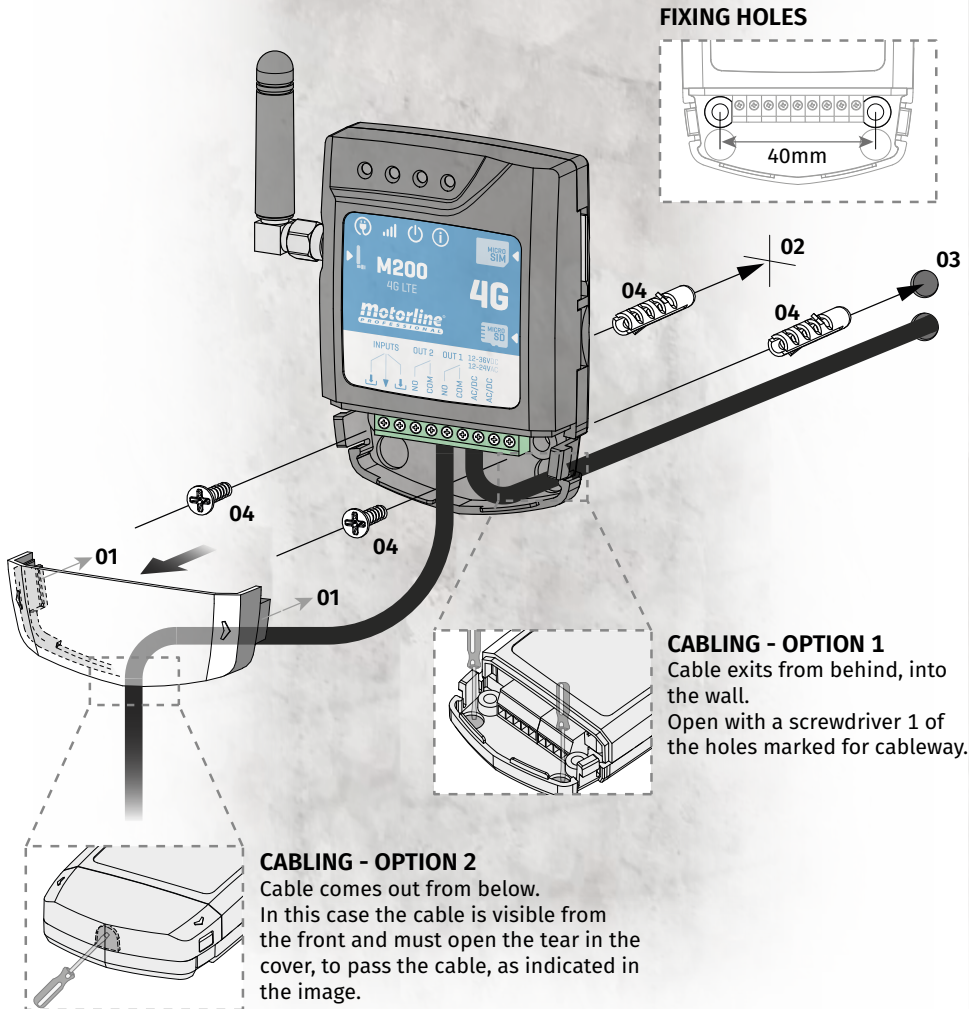

# INSTALLATION

## WIRING AND FIXING



### FIXATION

- 1 • Remove the cover of the machine by pulling on the side hooks.
- 2 • Mark the 2 fixing holes.
- 3 • Drill the holes.
- 4 • Attach the equipment using appropriate bushings and screws.

# INSTALLATION

## IMPORTANT NOTES



- The device initialization process should last approximately 30 seconds.
  - The MicroSIM card must have balance during initial setup if you want to configure via SMS. Otherwise the device cannot send feedback notifications.
  - **To keep the MicroSIM card active, the device automatically sends itself an SMS every 2 months.\***
- \*This operation may incur costs. For more information, check your service provider.**

## CONNECTIONS

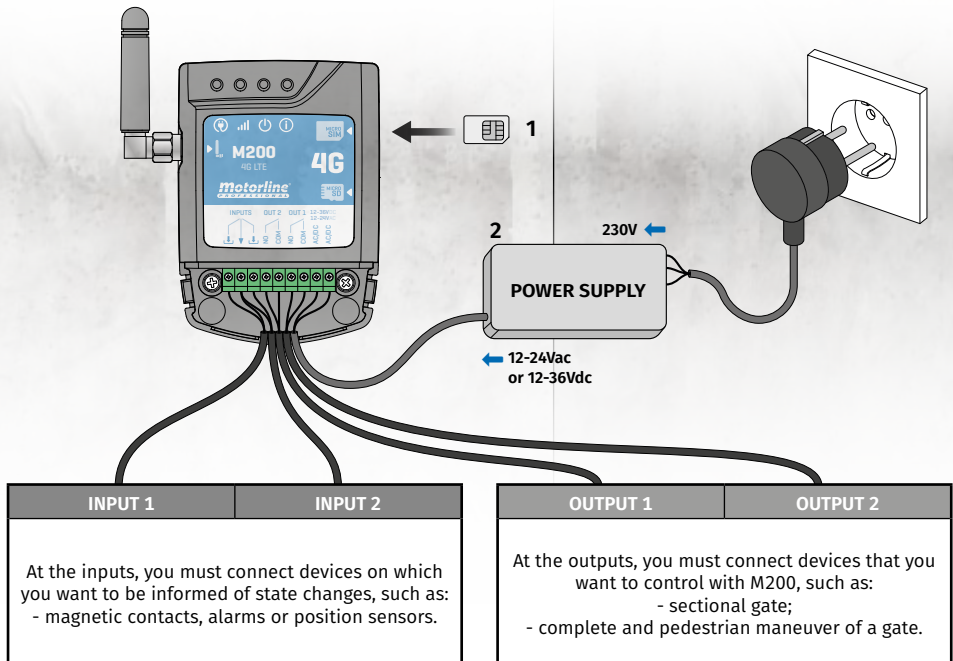


1 • For the M200 to work, it is necessary in the first configuration to insert the MicroSIM card in the slot before making the connections.

2 • Connect the device's outputs and inputs to the desired devices.

3 • Connect the device to a power supply, and POW, ACT and STAT LEDs will turn on.

4 • When the ACT LED starts blinking and the NET LED indicates the connection to the 4G LTE/GSM network, you can start programming the device.

## BACK TO M200 WITHOUT MOBILE DATA | PAUSE IN DATA TRANSMISSION

Relay 1 is associated with Input 1.

Once Relay 1 is activated, Input 1 will wait for a status change for the period defined by the owner:

- **If there is a change of status on Input 1 within the preset time, the M200 will notify that the alarm has been turned on/off;**
- **If there is no change of status, the M200 will notify that Input 1 has not changed within the predefined time.**

### ALARM ACTIVATION MODES

#### Local Mode:

When an alarm status change occurs, and it has not occurred remotely, the 1st contact on the list will receive a message with the alarm status change.

#### Remote Mode:

When a user actuates Relay 1 remotely, if he does not belong to the list, then the 1st contact on the list will receive a message indicating the alarm change.

If you belong to the list, only you will receive the message.

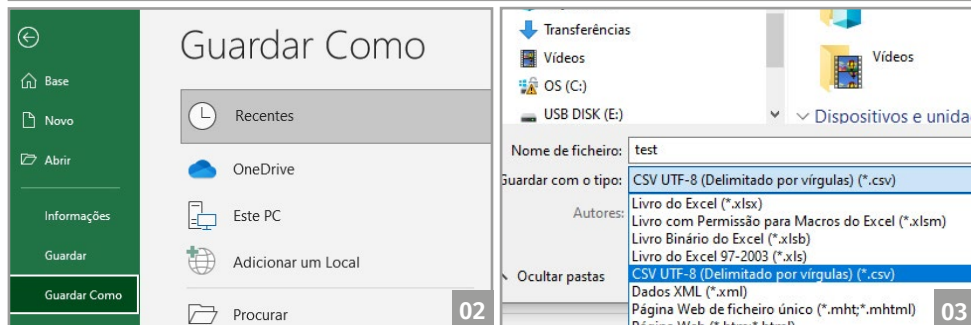
Before importing users, it is recommended to download the Excel file through the application, so that all fields are filled in correctly.

- 1 • Press "Export users" and choose the destination for the file.
- 2 • Transfer the file to your computer so that you can register new users.
- 3 • Fill in the data according to the Excel headers (see image 01).
- 4 • Save the file in the "CSV UTF-8" format (Comma delimited) (see image 02 and 03).
- 5 • Transfer this file to your phone.

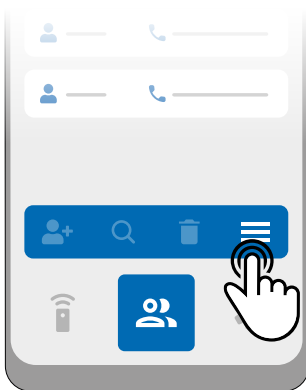

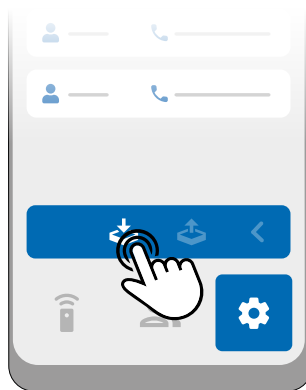

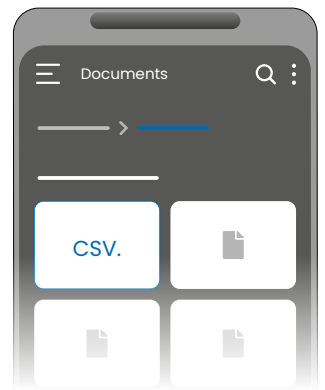
